I'm walking down Albany, towards Plasnewydd Road in central Roath. This is where madeinroath have their HQ. It's behind the ROADBLOCK. It's full of sun and street stalls, food and art, alive with people. Why is this place called Roath, or Albany for that matter? Roath, with its claims to pre-Roman origin is the name the city of Cardiff could have had if it had played its cards right. Albany Road was once Merthyr Road, renamed in 1884 to mark the death of Queen Victoria's eighth son, Prince Leopold, the Duke of Albany. Local objections were overruled.

Roath, on the other hand has always been Roath. Except when it was Raz or Rath or Ratostathibos, of course. Rath means fort - here was one where Cardiff Castle is now and another, maybe, on that slowly rising mound of earth where St Margaret's Church stands today.

Roath is the city's new cultural epicentre, snatching the crown clean and easy from arty Pontcanna. Round here we have more eateries, coffee shops and watering holes than the entire of Canton. When madeinroath first began in 2009, Roath had three galleries - today it has eight. Count them: g39, Albany, SHO, Oriel Makers, Cardiff MADE, Inkspot, Waterloo Gardens and The Gate. When you've got that much creativity bubbling then you need to celebrate.

And madeinroath does just that. It's run today by three artists, Gail Howard, Helen Clifford and Becca Thomas. It began as a sort of painters' open house day. Much in the style of the Royal Horticultural Society's open gardens weekends you could tour the district visiting the back rooms, basements and lofts of Roath's growing crowd of painters, makers and sculptors. In that first year ten studios opened their doors and running alongside there were thirty-one allied events. This year there will be twenty-seven open studios supplemented by a whacking two hundred events.

But don't expect a chaos of excess. madeinroath may have expanded its brief to include arts beyond the simply visual but it remains readily doable. Activity runs over two weekends with a bunch of linking days. It includes pop-up



galleries, open studios, strolling players, poets, peddlers, street food sellers, commissioned creatives, concerts, performances, platforms, innovations, interventions, installations, improvisations, broadcasts, publications, dances and diving, multi-cultural workshops, films and touring vans, knitting, cooking, brass bands, guitars, digital doodling, the Actual Museum of Roath as well as Roath's painterly finest. You can experience it all and only feel a little bit creatively blitzed. Check [madeinroath.com](http://madeinroath.com) on your phone for hit lists and guidance.

This is a festival for everyone. As the organisers will tell you, the people of Roath are as important as the place. Anyone can join in: for 2016 send in your ideas; if you've got a space, open it to the public; if you make in Roath then let Helen, Gail & Becca know. Meanwhile 2015 is three quarters gone. Fill the rest of it with art. Use the map on the back of this brochure. Start now.

# Welcome

## Highlights

madeinroath 2015 is set to be the biggest and most exciting festival we've ever presented! Here are some of the many things to look forward to during the week...

## Exhibitions

This year our Exhibitions programme is as exciting and diverse as ever. Perhaps you'll want to take in the quiet beauty of Crafters on Film at Deli Rouge, with finely crafted objects displayed alongside films of their making. You can celebrate 5 years of SHO Gallery with 'Hi five', or enjoy EASTN, a festival within a festival featuring works combining traditional art practices from across Europe, artefacts and customs with new technologies. Stiwdio 7 at Cathays Library is an exciting group show of upcoming Cardiff artists recently graduated from CSAD, while Ceramics in the City, at St Edwards Church features graduates of BA and MA Ceramics. And once again don't forget to look out around Roath for Richard Powell's ain'tnozooiroath billboards.

## Foto

We're really pleased that the madeinroath photography programme this year has expanded greatly, to partner with Ffotofringe. You can enjoy exhibitions including Peter Evans' Bradford PA, a photo documentary project based around the Pennsylvanian town, at the Roath Park pub (which we're really pleased to be working with again over the whole of the festival). Elsewhere around the streets it'll be hard to miss large scale highlights, such as Jon Pountrey's Cardiff before Cardiff images, a 5 year project that draws together unseen photography to tell the stories of Cardiff's past, or Whitewashed, Nick Davies' display of whitewashed empty shop windows from around the UK.

## Happenings

This year we have a jam packed Happenings programme – kicking off at Penylan Pantry on Sat 10, with an afternoon of live arts in their new community space. From there, you can make your way straight down to Waterloo Gardens Tea house to take in our Open Exhibition, before making your way to St Martin for a viewing of photographer Jim Mortram's first exhibition in Wales! Celebrate an exceptional evening of art with Time at the Bar, presented by Over Here at CF24 Project...

Don't miss Sounds of Roath, a large scale 'xylophone staircase' by Hannah McKimm in Roath Park Pavilion, a group show by Rhôd in Roath / Rhôd yn y Rhâth and exhibitions by Ian Watson in the Roath Park Pub and James Green in The Spice of Life! There are too many highlights to mention so simply browse this brochure and enjoy the ride!

## Films

As ever our film programme includes a mix of the child friendly – with Who Framed Roger Rabbit at The Globe, and the more adult – with Francis Ford Coppola's Apocalypse Now at g39. There are other exciting things to look out for, including the ever popular Roathbud.

## Music

Music is another part of the festival that has really expanded this year to include a whole host of gigs, performances and launches. Make sure you don't miss Austerity Frankenstein with Gareth Ziggy, Brik Pho & Electronic Music Wales – something really quite extraordinary coming to you from Albany Pets. Our ever popular Howardian Studio 22 Stage will once again feature on ROADBLOCK, and at The Record Shop on Inverness Place there will be Za Sonic's album launch.

## Open Houses & Open Studios

One of the enduring and popular elements of madeinroath is the Open Houses and Studios, where you can wander around the streets of Roath enjoying a glimpse into the creativity on our doorstep. This year make sure your stroll includes the diverse group show at 219 Mackintosh Place, including Glenn Carney and Laura McCormack. The front of 37 Alfred Street will be a treat – it's a collaboration between

Susanne & Lilith König, while Christian Hart and Nia Metcalfe have got a surprise for you in their front garden at 114 Straithnairne Street... Finally, make sure that you don't miss out 32 Kelvin Road where something very special is happening – Amgueddfa Cymru - National Museum Wales' natural history curators are bringing the museum to a family home!

## Spoken Word

You may have caught Solstice, our dedicated festival of spoken word over the summer, but don't worry if you didn't – there's still plenty you can enjoy over madeinroath week too. Festival favourite Mark Blayney will once again bring Octopoet to The Coffi House, while we celebrate the publication of Skylark Review, a new Cardiff based literary magazine at Waterloo Gardens Teahouse. Come along to ROADBLOCK on Saturday for a written portrait by Steven Kenward and Tereza Nekvasilova.

## Stage

Our stage programme this year includes traditional performances and encounters in unusual places... there's plenty to look forward to, including Vaughan Williams: Agent of LOVCRAFT and A Fête Worse Than Death by Karen Sherrard, both in the Roath Park Pub.

## Workshops

madeinroath wants you to get involved in the festival – and what better way than taking part in one of our many exciting workshops? You'll find a whole array of them at ROADBLOCK, including badge making, spin painting and pottery. Elsewhere you can Paint the Park at Roath Lake, one of the most beautiful spots in Roath, or maybe take part in the Big Draw with Becci Holmes at St Martin's church. You can even carve your own mask with Brian Denman at Roath Park bowling pavilion!

## ROADBLOCK

A highlight of this year's festival will be ROADBLOCK – our bubbling hub of community creativity located on a suburban street. Jess Brett will be performing a brand new dance inspired by the people of Roath. There'll be arts & crafts workshops for adults and children alike. Music from Vinyl Cruise & Studio 22, as well as an exhibition of photography in a unique space with Cardiff Caravan Gallery tour. ROADBLOCK is our party, a day when we gather together to reveal and celebrate the generosity, talent and creativity of our community!

We hope to see you there – it wouldn't be the same without you!

So there it is, a brief summary of just some of the things to expect and look forward to during madeinroath 2015 – keep reading for the many, many other events, happenings, installations or gatherings during the 9 days of the festival. ## Residencies
